As representatives of the nuclear energy industry, we are encouraged by today's multi-national fuel commitment, as it builds on the important work that our governments and industries began this past spring at the G7 Meeting of Climate, Energy, and Environment Ministers in Sapporo Japan.

Earlier this week at COP28, these same governments along with nearly 20 others set an ambition to triple nuclear energy capacity by 2050. As the demand for clean nuclear energy continues to surge around the globe, so too does the need for a reliable and secure fuel supply—which not only advances our decarbonization and energy independence goals but also strengthens our collective national security.
